# Mike's Musings

The Gospel of Matthew ends with the following verses in Matthew 28:18-20: Jesus came near and said to them, "All authority has been given to me in heaven and on earth. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Most of us have heard these verses numerous times. Jesus appears to the eleven remaining apostles after the resurrection and gives them this directive. Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them and teaching them to observe everything that I have commanded you. This directive is for all Christians today. To make a disciple, we should probably know what it means to be a disciple. The definition of disciple is a follower or student of a teacher, leader or philosopher. Who do you think of when you hear the word disciple? Many of us would say a pastor, Sunday school teacher, or a famous theologian, but what about you and me? Are we disciples of Jesus? Are we a follower or a student of Jesus?

We should examine our daily lives to determine the answer to that question. Does your time with God consist of an hour at church on the occasional Sunday? The average Christian attends church 2.5x a month. If that is the case, the average Christian spends 21 hours a year in church. Even if you went to church every Sunday, it is only 52 hours out of 8,760 hours in a year or 0.59% of your time. Recent data shows that the average person spends 3 hours and 15 minutes on their phone per day. This equates to 1,185 hours a year or 13.5%. If you are married, how well would you know your spouse if you only spent one hour a week with them? Probably not very well. How can you know God if you don't spend time with him?

The apostles had it good, as they got to live life with Jesus 24/7 for 3 years. We don't have access to the physical manifestation of Jesus on Earth; However, they didn't have the benefit of the New Testament and the Holy Spirit. We have access to numerous translations of the Bible in print or on our phones. Plus, there are thousands of reference materials and devotionals to help us study the Word of God to get to know Him better. We can also pray whenever and wherever we want. We have access to Bible studies, Christian books, sermons online from all sorts of preachers. Plus, we have the Holy Spirit to guide us.

Why is it important to study the Bible? As Christians, we should all be disciples or students of Jesus. By studying the Word, we get to know Him better and when we study the Word, we learn to discern when someone is not preaching from it. Finally, how can we teach or disciple others about "observing everything Jesus has commanded us" if we don't know what He commanded us to do. In his sermon on June 16<sup>th</sup>, Pastor Nathan shared that a Christian that reads the Bible four times a week or more is 230% more likely to share their faith with someone and 400% more likely to memorize Scripture. To be a teacher or make disciples, you do have to know enough about the subject to teach it. If you asked me to teach you how to play the drums, you would not learn much because I have no training to play the drums. The good news is that you don't have to be an expert in the Bible to teach people about Jesus, but you do need to know Him and know what the Word says.

Jesus tells us to go and make disciples of all nations! Before we ask ourselves if we are making disciples, we need to ask ourselves, "Are we disciples of Jesus?"

# Stewardship

1. **Faithfulness** The broadest responsibility of a steward who manages another person's possessions is faithfulness (1 Cor. 4:2). God tests our faithfulness in little things before He places us in charge of larger things (Matt. 25:21). Our faithfulness in managing what God has entrusted to us is a determinative factor in the responsibilities and rewards of our earthly and heavenly lives (Luke 12:40-44; 16:10-12; 1 Cor. 4:1-5).

2. **Diligence** God requires us to work for our living so that we will be able to provide for our own and share with others (Eph. 4:28; 1 Thess. 4:11-12; 2 Thess. 3:10). We are to be diligent in our work (Prov. 10:4-5; 12:24; 14:23), and not marked by slothfulness or procrastination (Prov. 19:15).

3. **Integrity** As Christians, our work and financial policies must be examples of integrity and honesty. Biblical ethics are absolute, not relative, and we must resist the temptation to get ahead by using shady business practices just because others are using them (Exod. 23:8; Prov. 10:2; 11:1; 20:10,23; 22:16; Zech. 8:16-17; Rom. 13:9-10). Money can do many things, but it is possible to pay too high a price for it. Dishonesty reveals a lack of real dependence on God's ability to provide for our needs and displays an attitude that God will not find out or discipline us. The Lord will not bless what we gain through dishonesty or get-rich-quick schemes. "Bread obtained by falsehood is sweet to a man, but afterward his mouth will be filled with gravel" (Prov. 20:17; cf. 13:11; 15:6,27; 16:8; 20:21; 21:6; 28:6,20,22).

## Library News

In July, Pastor Nathan shared a message based on Colossians 3:16.

*Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts.*

As he noted, for the message of Christ to dwell among you richly, you must read it on your own. It can be difficult to pick up a Bible and start reading without direction or a guide. Please consider the church library as a resource to support your daily Bible reading. A religious book from the church library can suggest an organization for your reading and provide scripture references about your subject of choice. We have materials in the library for those relatively new to in-home Bible study and also for those of you who are advanced in study. Starter home study suggestions:

- *Sermon on the Mount: A Beginner's Guide to the Kingdom of Heaven* by Levine-- Matthew 5-7, contains some of Jesus' most profound and most memorable teachings.
- *Servanthood as Worship* by Palmer--offers Christians a biblical understanding of their

calling to serve in the local church, motivated by our grace in the gospel.

- Max Lucado's books are presented as Bible studies. They are easy reading for everyday Christians with a wealth of Bible verses suggested for your further study. We have a section of his books for general Christian living. They are located under the window.

Advanced home study suggestions:

- *The Trustworthiness of the New Testament: The Significance of Recent Discoveries* by Ramsay--a faith builder for us and an apologetic tool to share with skeptics and those who may have begun to doubt.
- *Seven Things I Wish Christians Knew About the Bible* by Bird—The book presents a clear and understandable evangelical account of the Bible's inspiration, canonization, significance, and relevance in a reconciling and compelling way.

The library also has many versions of the Bible, including the King James Version, the English Standard Version, and The Message. These alternate versions are helpful for both deep engagement in the reading and for gaining understanding when the wording of a verse or section is challenging.

We hope you will find these resources helpful in your faith walk. If you have questions about what you read, contact the church office and we will find someone to assist you.
